

Dear Parent/Guardian of incoming seventh grade student:

Minnesota Immunization Law 121A requires that children enrolled in school be immunized against certain diseases or file a legal medical or conscientious exemption.

Your child is entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade and that is when booster immunizations are typically given.

Each student is required to show proof of receiving the necessary immunizations or provide a notarized statement of medical or conscientious objection. Please submit your child's immunizations records to the school office as soon as possible and no later than the first day of school.

To enter school as a7<sup>th</sup> grade student, a student must show proof of having the following immunizations or exemption:

- 2 Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) (1st dose must be after age 1)
- 1 Tetanus Diphtheria Pertussis (Tdap) Booster given after age 11
- **3 Polio Immunizations**
- 3 Hepatitis B Immunizations
- 2 Chicken Pox (Varicella) (spaced at least 28 days apart) or proof of illness
- 1 Meningococcal Immunization (given at age 11-12)

Please use the Pupil Immunization Record to document if your child had chicken pox disease. Your physician will need to complete that section. The form is also used to document that your child is exempt from immunizations for 7<sup>th</sup> grade entry.

A parent/guardian signs the Pupil Immunization Record in front of a notary public for the immunization exemption to be valid. If your child was exempt from immunizations as an elementary student and you wish to continue that option a **new form must be submitted when they enter 7**<sup>th</sup> **grade.**
